

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#### Organise like a pro...

#### 12 tips from professional organisers.

- The first step is to take out everything that doesn't belong in the room, You know, dishes, paperwork, toys!
- Don't waste time organising what you don't need. Get rid of anything that is not being used, doesn't fit, is expired or that you simply don't like!
- 3. Start small. Set a 15-minute timer and start with one drawer. Empty it out completely don't pick at it!
- 4. Involve the family. Develop a system and stick to it. Provide baskets, bins and storage making it easy for them to help.
- 5. Remember household tasks are quicker and easier than you think!
- 6. Deal with paperwork as it arrives, don't pile it up. Sort, shred, file immediately.
- 7. Use available space hooks on the back of a door, or wheeled under the bed storage.
- 8. Use the vertical space in your bathroom as much as possible. Hooks on the back of door, over door pockets or shelving over the toilet for towels.
- 9. Why not keep a laundry basket for each person in their room. Washing clothes by person versus type of clothing removes the sorting out stage. Everyone can even do their own basket!
- 10. Remove outer packaging when you buy in bulk. It's easier to grab a roll of toilet paper that is unpackaged than wrestle with the plastic bag again and again. Typically, items take up less space too!
- 11. Clean or pack away dirty dishes in to the dishwasher straight away. It only requires a few minutes.
- 12. Use a clear plastic container to sort medicines, either by family member or by illness.

My husband and I, with the help of our grandson have just reduced the height of a 100foot leylandii hedge by just over six feet. What a mammoth job! Numerous car loads to the tip with the cuttings, then the car to clean. We were so pleased when it was done.



It has made me think about hedges quite a lot! After surviving the bloody landing on the beaches of Normandy on D day, Allied troops worked their way inland only to find themselves fighting their way through Norman hedgerows dating back to the Roman Empire. To keep their livestock penned in, the Normans had built mounds of earth and planted dense hedges on top. The branches of the prickly hedge became interlaced to make impenetrable walls of vegetation. Even the Sherman tanks were vulnerable as their un-armed underbellies became exposed to antitank fire as they tried to go up and over the earthworks.

If like me, you enjoy a countryside ramble you will know that the British countryside with trails between neighbouring hedgerows is a place of great beauty and wonderful ecological diversity. Nesting birds, breeding insects, spiders webs, berries, mosses, lichens and flowers, whatever the time of year there is something interesting to see.

For privacy or security, a green living hedge often works much better than a fence. Particularly if the hedge is evergreen and prickly!

In the Bible, God was accused of putting a hedge around the good man Job and protecting him from harm. I like to think that the prickly impenetrable hedge can be a metaphor for the ring of angels that excel in strength and surround us at God's command.

Let us pray each day for divine protection as we go about our daily lives. But, just like those Norman earthworks were built to keep the animals safely housed, we too must choose to stay within His guidance.

#### **Tonsillitis**

Tonsillitis is an inflammation of the tonsils. Your tonsils will probably be swollen and sore. It is most common in children, but anyone can have it.

The tonsils are glands at both sides of the back of your throat. They help protect you against infection. Tonsillitis is usually caused by a virus, or occasionally by a bacteria, and often follows a cold. You can't be immunised against tonsillitis so you can't prevent it, although good hygiene can help. You can have tonsillitis more than once.

People with tonsillitis often feel unwell and they may have:

A sore throat. Fever. Headache. Bad breath. Difficulty swallowing. Stiff neck.

Red, swollen and painful tonsils, sometimes with white patches.

Swollen lymph nodes in your neck.

Other cold symptoms are; a runny nose, cough or sore eyes. Younger children may have nausea, vomiting or stomach pain, they may drool a lot because they can't swallow. Not every sore throat is due to tonsillitis.

Paracetamol and ibuprofen can reduce discomfort, fever or headache. If you have tonsillitis, rest and drink plenty of fluids. You can gargle with saltwater and use throat lozenges to reduce discomfort. Ice cream, jelly and soft, cool foods can soothe a sore throat. Contact your doctor if a sore throat doesn't improve in a few days or causes: difficulty breathing or swallowing; a persistent fever; severe pain, particularly if it's mainly on one side of your throat. Some people with tonsillitis will need antibiotics.

Some people who have recurring bouts of tonsillitis will be offered surgery to remove their tonsils. The operation is known as a tonsillectomy. People who have a tonsillectomy will need a general anaesthetic, and often stay in hospital overnight. There is a risk of heavy bleeding after the operation. Tonsillectomy doesn't prevent sore throat from coming back. Some people have a lot of pain afterwards, and it can take up to 2 weeks to recover. You should talk to your doctor or ENT specialist about whether a tonsillectomy is likely to help you.

## Recipe page... Creamy Vegetable Curry

#### Ingredients

160g Spinach

250g Basmati Rice
1 tablespoon Vegetable Oil
1 Clove Garlic, peeled and chopped
5 tablespoons Tikka Masala Curry Paste
400ml Can Coconut Milk
1 Vegetable Stock Cube
150ml of Water
approx. 600g Sweet Potatoes (about 3) peeled and diced



#### Method

- Cook the rice according to the packet instructions.
- 2. Meanwhile heat the oil in a large pan, stir in the garlic and curry paste and fry, stirring continuously for 2 minutes.
- 3. Pour over the coconut milk and 150ml water, add the stock cube and stir in the sweet potatoes.
- 4. Bring to the boil and simmer for 15 minutes until the sweet potatoes are tender.
- Remove from the heat and season. Stir in the spinach until just wilted and serve with the basmati rice.

If you want to freeze this recipe then do so before you add the spinach - just stir that in when you are ready to eat it.

#### Serves 4

10 minutes preparation 20 minutes cooking.

#### Monthly Meditation -

King David had got himself in big trouble! While his general Uriah was off fighting his battles, David was seducing his wife, and she was pregnant! David needed to hide this sin and do it very quickly. He re-called Uriah so he could have a weekend at home with his wife, thinking that would do the trick! But Uriah was a faithful soldier, while at home, he refused to have any home luxuries when he knew his men were on the battlefield. On finding this out David tried another tactic. He wrote a letter to another general named Joab and sent it back with Uriah. In the letter he wrote, "Put Uriah in the front lines where the fighting is the fiercest. Then pull back and leave him exposed so that he's sure to be killed." 2 Samuel 11:14-15

Uriah did not die because he could not handle the intensity of the battle, but he died because of the negligence of those who were supposed to support him in the battle zone. His fellow soldiers sold him out. Those who were supposed to cover him, "exposed" him for the enemy to devour him. The paradox here is: the true enemies of Uriah were not those he was fighting in the front, but those he was expecting to protect him in the back.

We must understand that Uriah was a skilful, well trained, and disciplined soldier. He was one of the best in David's army. But still he could not fight the battle alone, he needed a faithful team to back him up. It's not that he was weak or inexperienced, the real issue here is not weakness, the real issue here is "negligence".

Strong soldiers have died in the field because of negligence, and have been fatally wounded in the field because of the indifference of others.

When we choose to pull back in a time of trouble and need, other innocent and faithful people die either physically, emotionally or spiritually because of us.



When we pull back and expose others to danger, ridicule, or hurt we become co-workers with the enemy of God and God is watching us. God will hold us accountable for neglecting others in times of need.

This month let us commit to being extra careful with the lives of others. Promise never to neglect others especially in times of need. Be a true friend and support at home, at work and as you socialise.

Share each other's troubles and problems, and so obey our Lord's command. Galatians 6:2

Lesson 1

David deliberately chose to do wrong. He saw and wanted his friend and fellow soldier's wife. We are all tempted daily to do wrong. For each one of us the temptation comes in different ways. The devil knows where we are weakest! We can all lie, cheat, steal, commit adultery, or be fraudulent. There is nothing wrong with being tempted. The wrong only comes when we carry it out. Pray for power that you will resist the temptations that come to you.

#### Lesson 2

Having done wrong and knowing he would be found out. David tried his hardest to cover it up, using several tactics to do so. Those who are emotionally and spiritually mature can admit when they have done wrong, take responsibility for their actions and the consequences.

#### Lesson 3

As the king he ordered others to carry out the murder on his behalf. It is time for us to stop and think if others influence us to do things we know are wrong. When my own two children were very small, the older one would always get the younger one to do something first, just to protect herself from trouble. We must not use or influence others to carry out deeds that we do not want to do ourselves. Let's be responsible!

#### Lesson 4

It took David many months before he admitted his sin and asked God for forgiveness. The consequences of this simple choice lasted for the remainder of his life. God always forgives if we are sorry, but he does not remove the consequences of our actions. Let's learn from the mistakes of others that are recorded in the Bible, rather than make the mistakes ourselves.

#### Think about this...

A great proportion of the wretchedness which embitters married life, has originated in a negligence of unimportant things. Don't be negligent in doing good!
